The consensus was to try to develop a common mission, perhaps gathering for a weekend retreat to write a SCALLOPS manifesto. Groups talked about local actions, organizing fairs. SCALLOPS may organize some one or 2-day, homestay field trips (going by train) to Portland and Vancouver B.C. to meet sustainable people in those towns and see first-hand unique sustainable city implementation projects (bike boulevards, community gardens and kitchens, energy retrofits.
